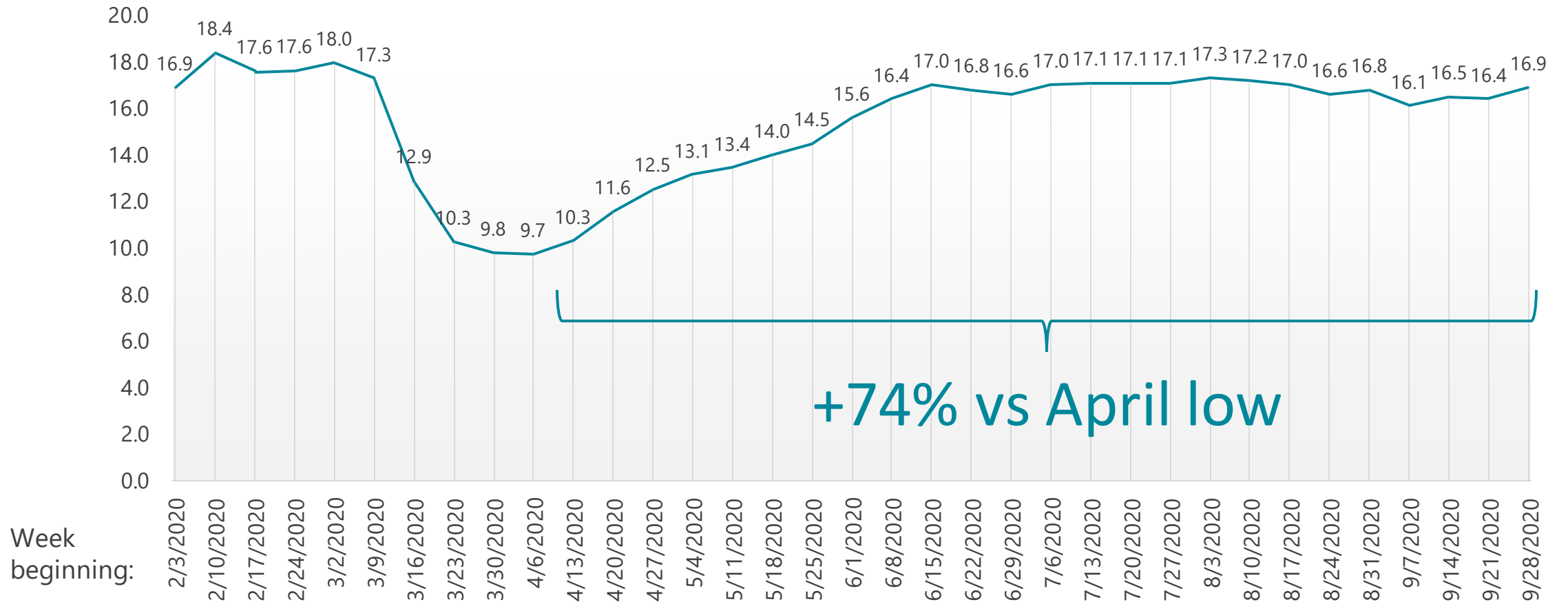

Average miles traveled per day remain relatively stable.

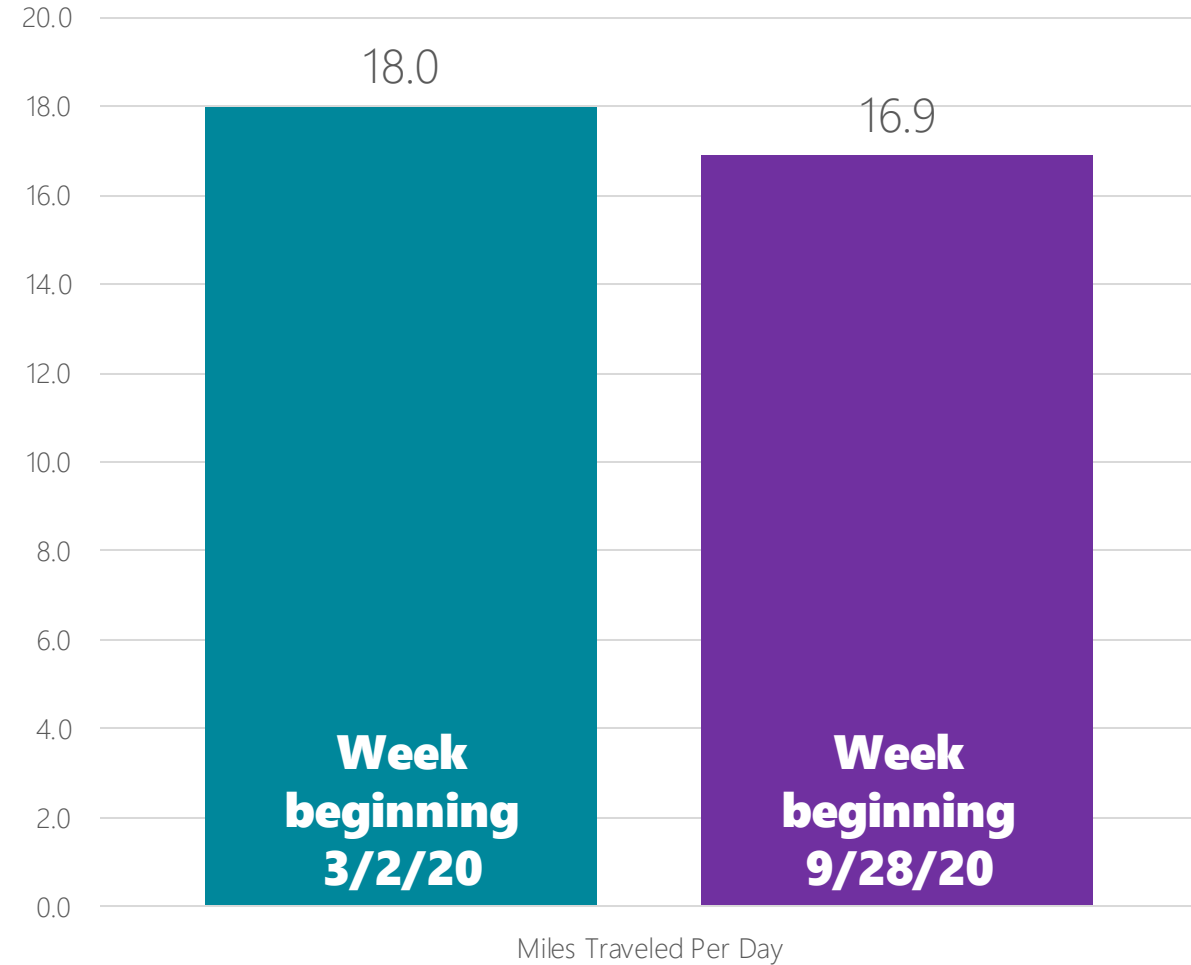
Avg Total Miles Traveled Per Day

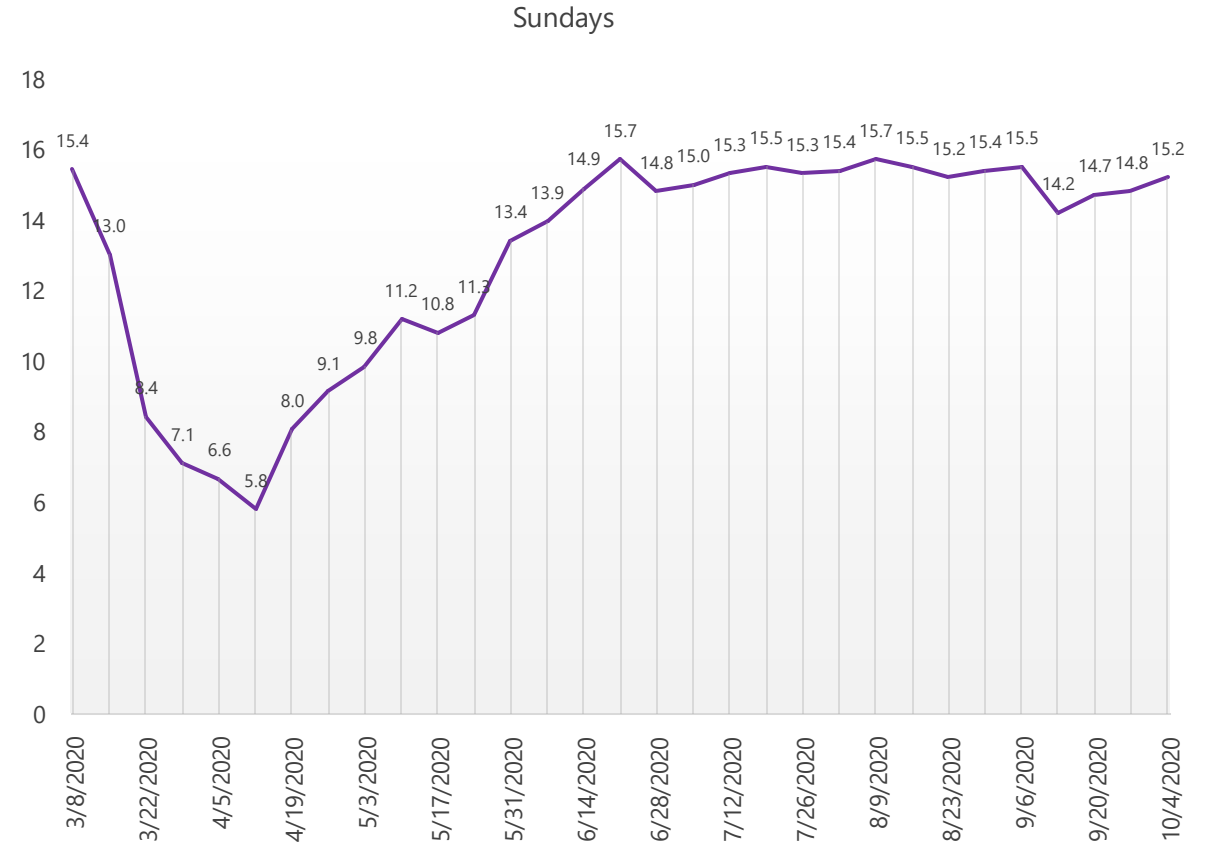
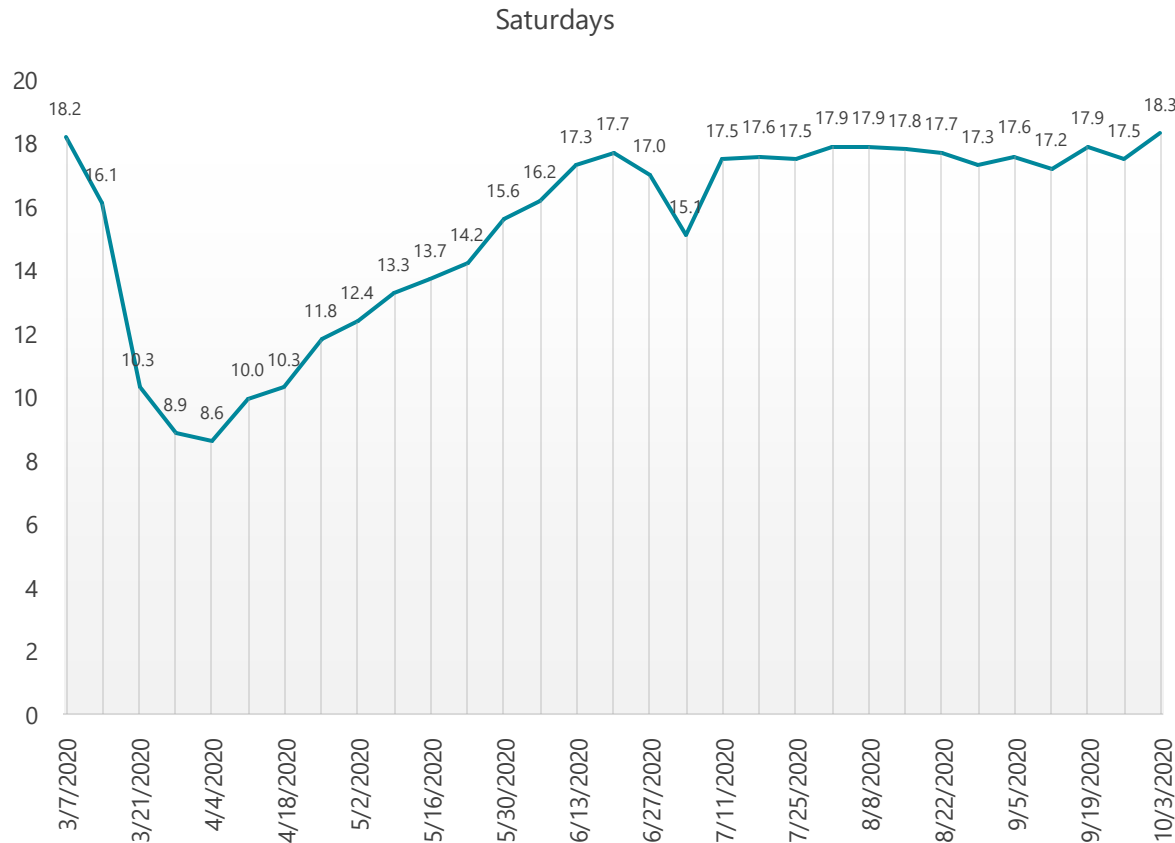
USA Average Weighted Average By County

Average miles traveled daily for the week of 9/28 represents **94%** of the travel occurring the first week of March prior to COVID-19 restrictions.



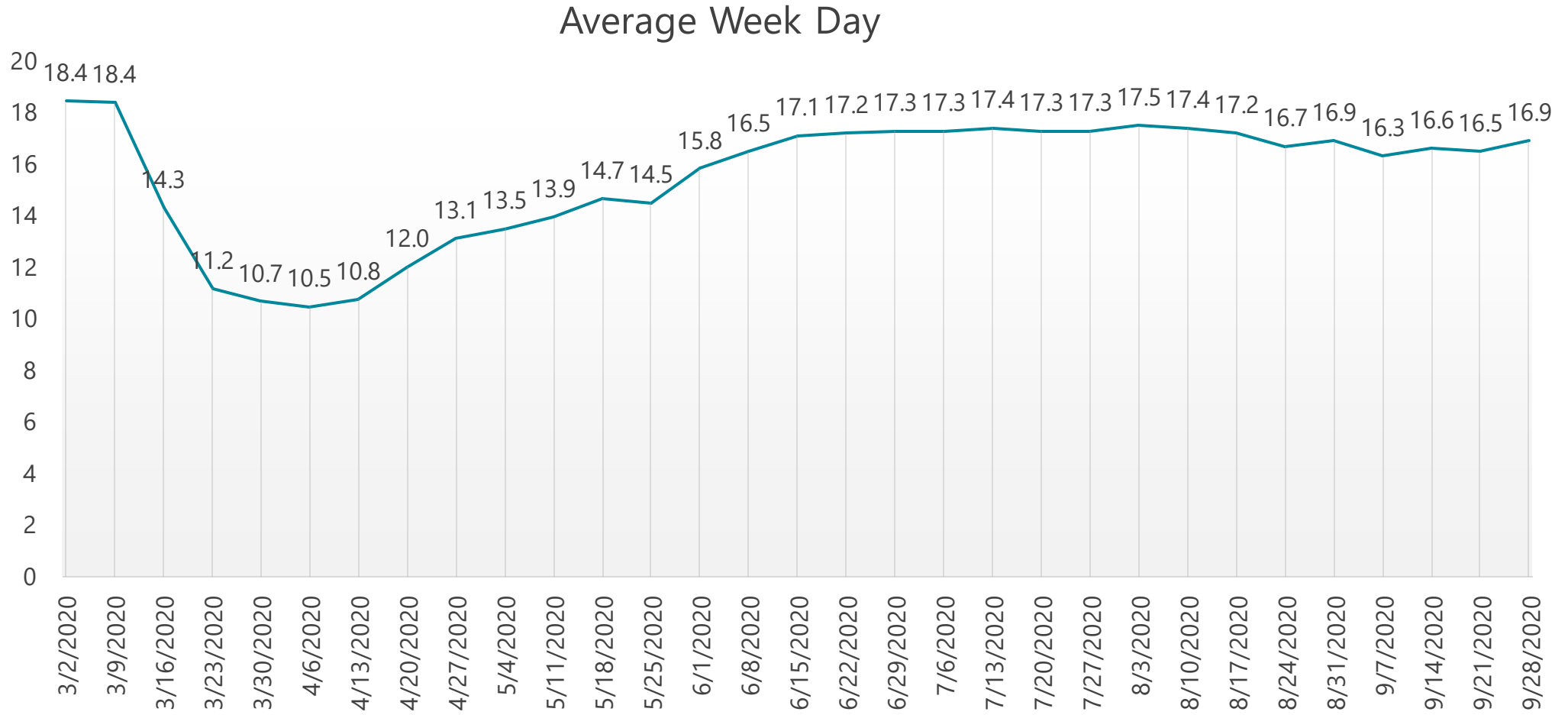
USA Average Weighted Average By County

Miles traveled on Saturday were the highest seen since the April lockdowns, breaking 18 miles.



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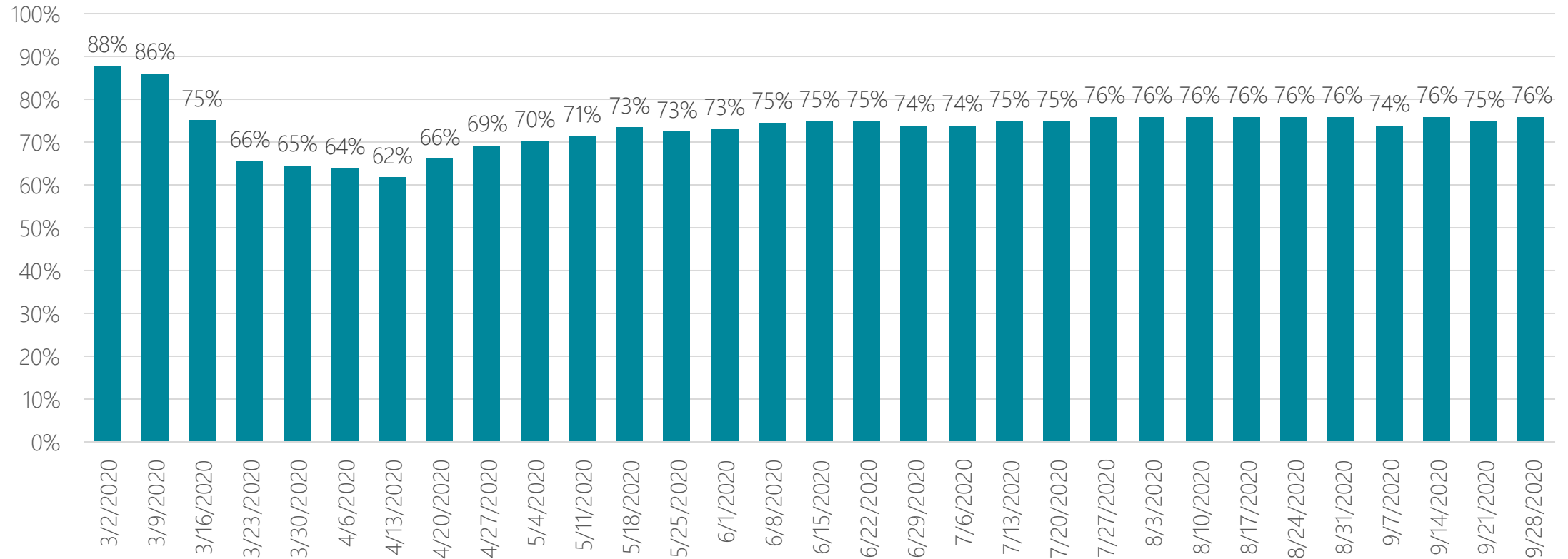
Average miles traveled on weekdays continues to remain relatively stable, up 0.4 of a mile week over week.



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The number of people traveling beyond one mile from their homes daily has stabilized, with approximately 3 out of 4 people leaving their homes on the average day.
